Dueling Bach Concert

What: Dueling Bach [Concerto Transcriptions for Two Organs]

When: Saturday, January 18, 2020; 7:30 PM

Who: Katherine Crosier and Jieun Kim Newland, Organists Where: Lutheran Church of Honolulu, <u>1730 Punahou Street</u>

Cost: Suggested donation, \$25.

Summary: When Bach moved to Weimar in 1708 to take up the position of organist at the court of Duke Wilhelm Ernst, people were abuzz with the music of Antonio Vivaldi. Always an enthusiastic student, and eager to please his employer, Bach went to work and transcribed at least nine concertos of Vivaldi, three for solo organ and six for solo harpsichord.

Katherine Crosier and Jieun Kim Newland have further arranged several of these concertos for the two Beckerath tracker organs, placed on opposite sides of the church, with the aim of exploiting the maximum possibilities for echo effects and infinite colors. In addition, the duet concert will include popular favorites, "Sinfonia from Cantata 29," "Jesu, joy of man's desiring," and Brandenburg Concerto No. 3.

This unique concert will have only one performance. No other organists in the world have arranged these concertos for organ duet.

Suggested donation, \$25. Additional parking is available in the adjacent Poki Street Lot. The concert is a benefit for the American Guild of Organists, Hawaii Chapter.
