We know you faithful resourceful members and friends have already started to put aside the following items. Start bringing them to church on the designated dates below:

1. On Sundays ... March 1st, March 8th, and March 15th bring:

- a. clean plastic gallon size (or smaller) garden pots
- b. Tillandsia type small air plants to church. Leave them outside under the blue pew nearest the office.

2. In April bring:

- a. Rummage Sale items: new to gently used kitchen and household items such as utensils, pots 'n pans, books, toys, small working appliances, electronic devices, personal use items etc. but NO CLOTHING OR SHOES. Place them on the mauka end of Kosasa Hall.
- b. One gallon five gallon size containers which can hold water for water garden plants
- c. Clean, gently used shopping bags for our customers to take home their goodies
- d. Potted Plants should be put outside in the back of Kosasa Hall
- e. Water plants and grasses
- f. Red wiggler worms (April 12th)

Waterless carwash tickets are now being sold for Green Day VII. Your car will be vacuumed too! Get them from any Missions Committee member. Green Day chairperson Becky Kanenaka can direct you to a member who has tickets.
