We know you faithful resourceful members and friends have already started to put aside the following items. Start bringing them to church on the designated dates below:

## 1. On Sundays ... March 1st, March 8th, and March 15th bring:

- a. clean plastic gallon size (or smaller) garden pots
- b. Tillandsia type small air plants to church. Leave them outside under the blue pew nearest the office.

## 2. Starting April 12 bring:

- a. Rummage Sale items: new to gently used kitchen and household items such as utensils, pots 'n pans, books, toys, small working appliances, electronic devices, personal use items etc. but NO CLOTHING OR SHOES. Place them on the mauka end of Kosasa Hall.
- b. One gallon five gallon size containers which can hold water for water garden plants
- c. Clean, gently used shopping bags for our customers to take home their goodies
- d. Potted Plants should be put outside in the back of Kosasa Hall
- e. Water plants and grasses
- f. Red wiggler worms

### **Hand Sanitizer Recipe**

Having a hard time finding hand sanitizer on the shelf? Try this recipe to make some at home. This will make one cup and can be doubled or tripled. Combine 2/3 cup rubbing alcohol, 1/3 cup aloe (find it in the sun screen aisle), and if fragrance is desired, 6-8 drops of an essential oil of your choice (find at places like Whole Foods). Put into a pump or squeeze bottle & use frequently. I found that inverting the bottle & shaking vigorously did the best job of mixing the ingredients. It felt very thin the first night, but the next day it felt thicker and remained emulsified. It was not drying on the skin.
