NCC Plan in Response to the Covid-19 Pandemic

Adopted by the Council on March 17, 2020

- 1. Sunday services at NCC are temporarily suspended effective March 22, 2020.
- 2. An ad hoc team will explore ways to have an online "virtual" church service. In the meantime, homilies will be posted on the Church's website (www.nuuanu.org).
- 3. Special services such as wedding, and memorials will be handled on a case-by-case basis and will be decided in collaboration with the family, church staff, and the Executive Committee.
- 4. Regular users of church facilities (e.g., Kosasa Hall, Choir Room, Library, etc.) will be suspended until further notice. This includes Boards, Committees and special interest groups (Sew Fun, Hui Malama, etc.).
- 5. The church office will be operational, but will not be open to the public.
- 6. Pastor Jeannie will continue to provide pastoral care upon request.

- 7. Members are asked to leave a message with the church office (595-3935) if a need arises.
- 8. In an effort to maintain contact with our church members, the Diaconate will be contacting members from time to time.
- 9. Updates, news and other information will be sent via email with hard copies sent to those without email addresses. If you have an email address and are not yet receiving NCC's weekly e-News, please be sure to email Paula at <a href="mailto:necodmin@hawaiiantel.necodmin@hawaiiant

Hand Sanitizer Recipe

Having a hard time finding hand sanitizer on the shelf? Try this recipe to make some at home. This will make one cup and can be doubled or tripled. Combine 2/3 cup rubbing alcohol (60% or more), 1/3 cup aloe (find it in the sun screen aisle), and if fragrance is desired, 6-8 drops of an essential oil of your choice (find at places like Whole Foods). Put into a pump or squeeze bottle & use frequently. I found that using a wire whisk did the best job of mixing the ingredients. It felt very thin the first night, but the next day it felt thicker and remained emulsified. It was not drying on the skin. --Judy Keith
