## A New Church Year

On Sunday, December 3, we begin a new church year, a sign that the church has its own unique calendar, which is not to be confused with the calendar kept by the larger society. As Christians, we cannot help but be grateful for the calendar we keep.

Our calendar begins with our anticipation of the birth of Jesus, and then continues with the celebration of his Nativity and our remembrance of the visit of the wise men on the Sunday of Epiphany. We next recall his Baptism and immediately follow him into the wilderness where he was tested. We then witness the beginning of his ministry of healing and teaching. Not long after, we journey with him to Jerusalem and the cross. On Easter Sunday we celebrate his Resurrection and fifty days later recall the beginning of the Early Church with the coming of the Spirit on the Day of Pentecost. We return to the tracing of his ministry for the remaining weeks of the church year until we come to the last Sunday when we give thanks for his eternal reign.

But the church year has become even more important to me with the passing of time. For in our remembrance of the life and ministry, the birth, death and resurrection of Jesus, we are able to get in touch with our own human experience of new beginnings, our own seasons of both joy and suffering, despair, hope, and fulfillment that come to us in the midst of the chance and change of our lives, and also our experience of those ordinary days when we are thankful for the routines that give us order and stability in our lives. Truly, I would be at a loss for meaning in my life were it not for the keeping of the church year.

The church year offers us an anchor of meaning in a world that seems, for me at least, to become more and more confusing and chaotic with each passing day. For this and our life of worship at NCC, we give thanks to God. Grace and Peace.
