

On October 6, we mainline Christians celebrate World Communion Sunday. It is a day with many facets, the main one being the unity of the Church in the vision of Jesus. "That they may all be one" (John 17:22), our Lord prayed, and it has become the UCC mantra. It is a magnificent vision, one of which we have fallen woefully short.

But there is another aspect of this special day that it is important for us to lift up: oneness out of diversity. We celebrate and affirm the reality that Christianity has reached the uttermost reaches of our globe, and that Christ is lifted up as lord in diverse ways. When I represented the UCC at the World Alliance of Reformed Churches (WARC) gathering in Ghana, Jayne and I had the privilege of worshipping in a Ghanaian new church start. The pastor apologized that the five-year old church "only" had 500 members! But what struck me most was the joyous nature of the worship. When it came to the time in the service to gather the offerings, accompanied by some lively, joy-filled music, worshippers literally danced down the aisle to place their offering in the bowl. It took nearly ten minutes to complete the ritual. These

mostly poor people (economically poor) gave with a sense of joy. I thought, if God loves a cheerful giver, these people must receive an abundance of God's love.

So, whether we worship in the quieter style of NCC, or in the raucous liveliness of an African church, we are one, serving one Lord, and worshipping that one God alone.

Neighbors In Need Offering

Neighbors in Need (NIN) is an annual missions special offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States.

Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries(JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM).

Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice. Funding is provided through donations to the Neighbors in Need offering.

The NIN offering will be received on **October 6**, **2019**. Checks may be written to Nu'uanu Congregational Church with NIN on the memo line.

Clearing Out Hale Ohana

Hale Ohana needs to be completely empty before the demolition crew can physically start demolishing the structure.

The vinyl floor tile and the mastic on the subfloor have asbestos containing materials. Per the Department of Health regulations, all asbestos containing materials need to be abated prior to the demolition of the structure. Before the vinyl floor tiles can be removed, ALL ITEMS in Hale Ohana and the garage need to be removed. The demolition contractor will not remove/dispose of those items.

The Board of Trustees has rented a trash dumpster that is placed on the concrete walkway outside of Hale Ohana. All groups who have items in Hale Ohana need to start throwing things away. Hale Ohana and the garage need to be totally emptied by **October 12, 2019**.


