

It's true confessions time. Throughout my fifty plus years of ministry, I have always looked at the coming seasons of Advent and Christmas with mixed feelings. Although I experience the same giddy excitement and anticipation most people do, I must confess that my innards churn as I consider all the work and busy-ness that this season creates for us ministers. I suspect I am not alone. Special services to plan and coordinate, end of the year reports to finish, and the hundred and one details to which I have to attend, add to the regular schedule of activities and meetings that fill my calendar. I don't say this to elicit sympathy, but just to confess I sometimes feel it's a time to endure and get through, not to enjoy. I feel cheated that I can't exult in the wonder of the holy nativity, God-in-flesh coming to us. Rather, I feel a great sense of relief when I get off the plane in Phoenix, satisfied that I got through another Christmas.

As I said, I suspect I am not alone among my clergy colleagues in this regard. But this sense of ambivalence does not reside solely among clergy. Many people have suffered significant loss recently. A loved one's passing, broken relationships suffered, financial setbacks, and the many other kind of significant losses that make a "holly, jolly Christmas" impossible. In previous years, I have held Blue Christmas services to help persons in these very situations celebrate the season in quiet, pensive ways.

Perhaps you know someone who is going through difficult times such as this. Why not be an angel of God, bringing the "good news of great joy, which shall be to all people." Reach out with a card. Meet them for coffee. Treat them for lunch. Even a phone call would mean a lot. In doing so, you become an instrument of God's grace and love.

And more recently, The Children's Center used Hale Ohana as a classroom.

Let us gather to bid farewell to this very special structure that provided us with a place to nurture our children and youth. There will be a decommissioning service for Hale Ohana on December 15, 2019 right after our 9:00 a.m. Worship Service.

Youth on a Mission

Our youth were asked to join youth at Community Church for Service Sunday on Sunday, November 10, from 10-1 pm. Steph and I participated. It was at RYSE(Residential Youth Services and Empowerment), a shelter for homeless youth ages 18-24, housing 30 youth with support services for daytime. At a minimum, the on-site living and dining quarters will offer homeless youth a safe place to sleep and receive a hot meal.

On-site services will include two levels of engagement and a day program. The first level of service provides a low barrier entry point for youth who are very "street-entrenched." "Street-entrenched." "Street-entrenched" youth are not ready to engage in services to get them off the street, but are seeking a safe place to sleep for the night. A youth may stay at this level for up to fifteen nights per month, giving them space and time to acclimate to a life off the streets. They are provided with a hot dinner each night and light breakfast the following morning. Service is provided on a first-come, first-served basis, with a capacity to house up to eight (8) youth per night.


