

Lifted Up and Broken

I love celebrating Holy Communion.

I love looking down at the bread no matter what kind of bread has been brought to the Lord's table. It is always a beautiful loaf because it is provided for us out of Christ's love for us, our love for him and our desire to remember him, and our love for one another.

I love that Christ gave us this ritual of feeding and being fed as the most important, intimate, and poignant way of remembering him.

Then, lifting up the loaf before the congregation and breaking it open—this is always such a holy moment. It is in that particular moment that we are reminded: it is only in the breaking-open of the loaf that the bread can be shared. It is only when it is broken that it is available to us in any meaningful way.

Lifted up and broken—that is the heart of Communion. It is also the heart of the whole story of Jesus Christ: his birth, life, ministry, death, and resurrection. It is the whole story of Easter.

When the loaf is lifted up for all to see it being broken, we are to remember how Christ was also lifted and broken. In that moment, again and again, we are meant to remember how our hearts are also meant for breaking, too—not in the sense of being injured. However, we too are meant to be lifted by the great love that God has for us. So great is this love that God sent God's only Son to live with us, to minister to us, and to show us how we should love one another.

Remembering this we are also reminded that the hearts and lives we so carefully guard are also meant to be broken open so that the love God freely pours out to us may flow in, and the love we have may flow out to our families, our neighbors, to all of God's beloved people.

It is in the taste and texture of the bread on our tongue that we are reminded of how God wants to feed our lives with God's very being.

This is much more than sign or symbol. This is a love that wants to become a part of the very cells of our bodies; a love that wants to become the energy we need to move toward one another with gestures of compassion, caring, and peace—all in Christ's name.

This month, Communion Sunday is also Palm\Passion Sunday...and we continue to be Scattered Pilgrims. Despite this, we will still find a way to celebrate the holy ritual of love and grace that is Holy Communion. The deacons will call you with the instructions, and they will be in the weekly email we send out.

There is so much for us to celebrate, even in these days of faithful distancing and sheltering in place. When we remember how deeply God's love for us goes; so deep that God's love could not remain in a grave of human making but, instead, broke open the grave so that love could come forth again...how can we help but be lifted up, our hearts broken open to receive the love and light of God.

I pray that this Communion Sunday will be just as meaningful and love-filled even as we partake of it in a new and different way.


The Chancel Choir's gift of music, "Were You There?," an Easter musical created by Dave Clark, will be presented at a later date.


