

New Joys Ahead

For you shall go out in joy, and be led back in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall burst into song, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands.

Isaiah 55:12

On those mornings when I do not automatically wake-up at 5:00, I have a furry alarm clock that does the job for me. His name is Toby, and he stands on my chest—all eighteen pounds of him—purring and batting at my chin until I am up and making moves toward the kitchen to get breakfast for him and his brother.

For part of the year—about November through early March—I have little gratitude for this service. When it is still dark at 5:00AM, I would prefer not to be bothered. The thought of "five more minutes" tempts me to want to gently push him away and turn over and go back to sleep. The darkness implies that I am entitled to more time, more sleep before the cares and tasks of the day are supposed to begin.

This year, both Toby and I have found our sense of timing a bit off. During these past few months, the importance of regulating my movements (waking and otherwise) to a particular hour has not been as urgent as it was. Thus, I find myself moving around the day episodically rather than systematically.

My home office is always within arm's reach and so I am as likely to be writing, reading, researching, etc. at 9:00PM as I am at 9:00AM. Even visiting on the phone is less likely to conform to a specific hour or length. In many ways we have been freer to fashion the day with more fluidity than formerly.

All that is going to change as our church begins to re-open and begin worshipping in our Sanctuary on Sunday, July 5. The last time you were together on Sunday morning was March 15, Pastor Wally's last Sunday with us. We had hoped to continue to worship in our Sanctuary for a few more Sundays, but the COVID-19 virus moved faster than we thought it would. By the very next Sunday, we were all "sheltering at home," and have been all of this while.

In-Person Worship

We look forward to reopening the church for inperson worship service on **July 5**, **2020**. The Diaconate and the Board of Trustees have created a protocol to reduce the risk and/or eliminate the transmission of COVID19 while we worship at Nu'uanu Congregational Church.

Prior to Entering into the Sanctuary

- •Put on your face mask prior to leaving your car.
- •Your temperature will be checked with a non-contact thermometer before you enter the sanctuary. [If you have a fever, you will be asked to return to your home.]
- Worship bulletins will be passed out by an usher/greeter who will be wearing gloves. [To reduce the risk of transmitting COVID19 through the worship bulletin.]

During Worship

- Wear your face mask all the time.
- •Keep your six feet or more social distancing from non-family/household members.
- •No red attendance books. [To reduce the risk of transmission of COVID19.]
- •No singing during worship. [To reduce the creation of aerosols, thus reducing the risk of transmission of COVID19.]
- •No choir. [To reduce the creation of aerosols, thus reducing the risk of transmission of COVID19.]
- •Quietly say the Lord's Prayer, to reduce the creation of aerosols.

- •Offering plates will be placed at the sanctuary entrance. You may place your offering envelope in the offering plate. If you touch the plate, please sanitize your hand.
- Joys and Concerns Someone will wipe the microphone prior to the next person speaking.
- Passing of the Peace Congregants can pass the peace by waving, acknowledging each other from where they are seated.
- •No receiving line. [Keep your social distancing.]
- •If you use the restrooms during worship, wash your hands properly and use a paper towel to shut the water off.

After Worship

- •Orderly exit of sanctuary led by ushers and greeters to keep the minimum of six feet social distancing.
- •No refreshments. [Reduce the risk of transmission of COVID19]
- •Disinfect the sanctuary in preparation for the next group using the sanctuary for worship.
- •Disinfect the restrooms for the next group to use.

These procedures may seem restrictive; however, all these procedures will be put into place once the sanctuary is opened for face to face worship, to reduce the risk or eliminate the risk of COVID19 transmission. As we learn more about this virus, along with the current recommendation from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Hawaii Department of Health, we will modify how we do our face to face worship. The Council and the Boards thank you for your patience, your compassion, your adaptability, your resiliency, and your desire to worship face to face after COVID19.

Family Finally Reunited!


