

Spirit-Led

By the time you read this, we will have celebrated Pentecost together in worship. I hope the lively music and the dramatic reading of the descent of the Holy Spirit stirred your heart. As I was talking about Pentecost this morning in Bible Study (Wednesday mornings at 10:00 AM in the choir room), I mentioned that Pentecost does not seem to be celebrated as fully and eagerly as befits the day in which the church was first gathered—the way in which Christmas and Easter are celebrated. I am not sure why this is so. I only know that I am sorry

that it is not.

I love Pentecost.

I am always intrigued by the concept of this part of the nature of God that is, at once, our protector and counselor who guides and keeps us from danger, but which is also meant to stir-up deep feelings in the hearts and lives of all whom she touches. (Yes, I experience of Spirit as female). I like the energy the Spirit brings into the gathered people. It is a powerful and hope-filled moment in the life of human beings.

We sing of a *Sweet Spirit*, and a *Spirit of Gentleness*. However, if you take another look at the description of what happened on that first Pentecost morning, it was greatly, madly wild—with wind and flames filling the place where the disciples were gathered. They are so lifted-up with energy and Spirit that soon they are pouring into the street. Let me repeat that: the Spirit touches them, *and they do not stay indoors*. They go out into the street, out to show themselves and to greet other people.

As they go among the throngs of Jews gathered from all over the known-world—all of them in Jerusalem for the Pentecost celebration of First Fruits—the Spirit also touches everyone they meet. Soon all of them are buttonholing each other and telling the story of Jesus and the Holy Spirit—a wild gaggle of voices and people mixing it up, communing and *communicating* with one another.

In that moment, all of the nicely constructed barriers that we built to keep us separate from each other were obliterated that morning by the Spirit. All who believed in Christ were drawn together into one family with one goal: to spread the word that God's radical, all-enveloping love is ours. It is also out in the world, going where it will to touch more and more lives with its goodness and righteousness.

Through the gift of tongues, we were given the gift of self-revelation. We were given the ability —perhaps even the obligation—to describe the way each of us have experienced God's love. Even more importantly, we were also given the ability to <u>hear</u> that other person's story.

In the United Church of Christ, we like to tell others that "God Is Still Speaking." The question I always find myself wondering about is: "are we still listening?" (cont'd on page 3 - Spirit-Led)

LGBTQ+ community, immigrants in any country, differently abled people, people of color in most western societies, and many, many more communities of people have not just been ignored, they have been silenced.

Indeed, you did not have to be a part of a minority. One of the largest groups of people on the planet—women—in many cultures and in many ways, women were also silenced and allowed only limited rights and dignity.




